Preschool Mission Statement



Who of you reading this is ready for spring? I see hands raised, heads nodding in agreement. Really, outside of the cold snap we had in Mid-January, you could say we really haven't had "winter". But as the calendar turns to March, we hold out hope that spring will arrive, it will warm up and stay warm, and that green will eventually be all around us. After all, there's Guardians baseball happening down in Goodyear, so doesn't that mean Spring is just around the corner?

The changing of seasons is something I think many people look forward to and appreciate. Each season brings its own change. Just as spring starts a cycle of new life, so also the coming joy of Easter starts a cycle of new life for God's people. February 14th began the church season of Lent. During these reflective 40 days, we do look forward to the joy & festivity of Easter. Lent can be a great reminder that we are "Easter people", people full of hope. Christian hope is stronger than our memory. Memory mostly makes us think about the past; all its' failures, unfulfilled promises, frustrations, disappointments. Hope refreshes us with a new beginning, not just in the spring, but for each new day we are given.

During Lent we pause and reflect on the extravagant, unmerited love of Jesus as he goes to the cross and dies as the perfect sacrifice for our sin & failures. The Scriptures remind us: "Being found in human form, [Jesus] humbled himself by becoming obedient to the point of death, even death on a cross. Therefore God has highly exalted him and bestowed on him the name that is above every name, so that at the name of Jesus every knee should bow, in heaven and on earth and under the earth, and every tongue confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father." [Philippians 2:8-11]

What a thought! One day every knee will bow down, every tongue will confess he is Lord of Lords and King of Kings. Even those who do not believe will be forced to bow their knees when they see the Lord and King coming in all his glory. Then they will go away to everlasting sorrow, separated forever from their Creator. By contrast, our knees will bow in humble adoration and our voices will proclaim, "How great Thou art!"

In the spring, the earth comes back to life. Day by day, the chosen and redeemed of God are renewed to live as the stewards God has made us, stewards who joyfully and freely manage all of life and life's resources for His purposes. This new life we have is not the same old, same old! It is exciting as we see and experience God's power in our lives and look for ways to manage our time, talents, and treasures that honor God. This spring, let's "spring" to new life as God's redeemed stewards. As believers we are working together and encouraging each other to manage all that we are and all we have been given to the glory of God!
